Our summer-long Heifer Project



- 1 It started with a dream, around 70 years ago, in which Midwestern Brethren dairy farmers and their neighbors, one person at a time, could respond to a tragedy on the other side of the world.
- 2 Much of Europe at that time was in shambles in the aftermath of World War II.
- 1 Something as simple as giving a family a heifer could provide milk for their hungry children.



- 2 And those Brethren farmers had cows to share.
- 1 Thus, Heifer Project was born.



- 2 The idea was simple.
- 1 Each heifer was given with but one condition:



- 2 when that cow had its first baby, the calf should be given to another family.
- 1 And that family would be encouraged to continue passing along the gift.
- 2 Over the seven decades since then, *Heifer International* has expanded its mission far beyond its Brethren roots, encompassing the world, passing along much more than heifers.



- 1 The simple idea behind it remains: provide people with what they need to feed themselves, and encourage them to pass along what theyøve received.
- 2 Heifer International also provides education, not only to those in need, but also to folks like us who have the opportunity to make a difference, one person at a time.



- 1 Perhaps you have visited the global village at Shepherd's Spring, which is connected to Heifer International.
- 2 School children come from all over to catch a glimpse there of how people around the world live, folks who can benefit from a simple gift.
- 1 Adults are welcome to tour that global village, also.



2 - Every year we have a special emphasis on this ministry, which had its beginning in the Church of the

Brethren.

1 - This year all of us are challenged to õRead to Feed.ö



- 2 õRead to Feedö is a summer-long reading program which, ideally, involves all generations.
- 1 How does it work?
- 2 Well, it starts with those of us who are adults.
- 1 We choose a young person with whom we will connect over the course of the summer.
- 2 Perhaps this is our own son or daughter.
- 1 Maybe it is a niece or nephew, or a grandchild.
- 2 It might be a child in our church, or even a neighbor.
- 1 Just reach out and invite them to participate in this program
- 2 You become their sponsor, challenging them to read throughout the summer.



- 1 õRead what?ö you might ask.
- 2 The sky is the limit. It doesnot have to be a book about heifers or hunger.
- 1 It can be any book, even one on a summer reading list recommended by their school, or something from our church library
- 2 We challenge them throughout the summer.
- 1 But here is the difference: we sponsor their reading. For every page, or chapter, or book they read ó whatever the two of you decide,
- 2 (It could even be the amount of time they spend reading)



- 1 you give them money to put in an õark bankö ó which will be collected at the end of the summer.
- 2 You choose the amount per page, chapter, book, or hour.
- 1 This money will go to *Heifer International* to pass along the gift to people in need.



- 2 We recommend that the first thing they read is the õReal Kids, Real Animalsö student guide, which tells how each animal can help a family.
- 1 You probably should read it, too, before you give it to them. That way, you learn something, also.



2 - The step first step is for every adult to pick up a õRead to Feedö packet.



- 1 You¢ll find these packets in in the back of the sanctuary.
- 2 In every packet is:



1 - an õenrollment formö



2 - a bookmark

1 - an ark bank



- 2 and a $\tilde{o}goody$ bagö of items to encourage along the way.
- 1 You can add your own goodies to this bag.



- 2 With this packet in hand, connect with your young person and invite them to participate in this õRead to Feedö program.
- 1 Would they like you to sponsor them?

- 2 A young person can have more than one sponsor,
- 1 and an adult can sponsor more than one child.



- 2 Have them fill in the enrollment form and give it back to you.
- 1 Your name goes where it says õteacher/leader.ö
- 2 You will put the enrollment form in a jar here at church.



- 1 Between the 2 of you, decide how much you are willing to sponsor, and how you will pay,
- 2 whether by the page, by the chapter, by the book, or by the amount of time they read.
- 1 Check in with them throughout the summer. How are they doing?
- 2 Give them their money to put in their ark bank.



- 1 At the end of the summer they return their ark bank, either in person on a Sunday, or through you.
- 2 The grand total from all the ark banks will be sent to *Heifer International*.



- 1 Right now, there are 27 õRead to Feedö packets in the back. That *ø*s our goal ó 27 readers with sponsors. But we can always make more.
- 2 Now, feel free to adapt this program.
- 1 õHow?ö you might ask.
- 2 Well, reading is not just for kids.



- 1 Challenge the folks in your Bible study,
- 2 your Book Club,
- 1 challenge the person next to you to really read our monthly church newsletter,
- 2 or our weekly õjoys and concernsö emails.
- 1 Or, read with your feet. Challenge others on our Saturday walks ó sponsor them step by step.
- 2 The possibilities are endless

- 1 Fill an ark. In so doing õpass along the gift.ö
- 2 One person at a time does it all.

õOne person at a timeö

We turn now to the second letter of the apostle Paul to the church in Corinth. Prior to this point in his epistle, Paul has written that the gospel of Jesus Christ is a õtreasure.ö However, those who carry it, who bear it and share it, are like breakable õclay jars.ö We are õafflicted ... but not crushed,ö he writes; õperplexed ... but not despairing,ö õpersecuted, but not forsaken,ö õstruck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in (these clay jars) the death of Jesus, so that his life may be made visible in our bodies.ö He then goes on to say the following. ¹³ But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scriptureô õI believed, and so I spokeöô we also believe, and so we speak,¹⁴ because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. ¹⁵ Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

¹⁶ So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. ¹⁷ For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, ¹⁸ because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.

^{5:1} For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

1 Samuel 8:4–20, 11:14–15



And now we move on to a rendezvous at Ramah. Where this place was is not exactly clear, which is probably not a bad thing. Decisions were made here than completely changed what had been a tribal federation into a monarchy, just because that s what people wished for. Imagine, if you will, a campground of tents in the middle of an arid valley. This is a temporary home for the people who have gathered to come up with a new way of governing themselves. Samuel is the last of the Judges of Israel, and perhaps the first of its Prophets, speaking for God. Listen. *(take a breath)*

- 1 Then all the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah, and said to him,
- 2 õYou are old and your sons do not follow in your ways; appoint for us, then, a king to govern us, like other nations.ö
- 1 But the thing displeased Samuel when they said,
- 2 õGive us a king to govern us.ö
- 1 Samuel prayed to the Lord, and the Lord said to Samuel,
- 2 õListen to the voice of the people in all that they say to you; for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them. Just as they have done to me, from the day I brought them up out of Egypt to this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so also they are doing to you. Now then, listen to

their voice; only - you shall solemnly warn them, and show them the ways of the king who shall reign over them.ö

- 1 So Samuel reported all the words of the Lord to the people who were asking him for a king. He said,
- 2 õThese will be the ways of the king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and appoint them to his chariots and to be his horsemen, and to run before his chariots;
- 1 and he will appoint for himself commanders of thousands and commanders of fifties, and some to plow his ground and to reap his harvest, and to make his implements of war and the equipment of his chariots.
- 2 He will take your daughters to be perfumers and cooks and bakers.
- 1 He will take the best of your fields and vineyards and olive orchards and give them to his courtiers.
- 2 He will take one-tenth of your grain and of your vineyards and give it to his officers and his courtiers.
- 1 He will take your male and female slaves, and the best of your cattle and donkeys, and put them to his work.
- 2 He will take one-tenth of your flocks, and you shall be his slaves.
- 1 And in that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves;
- 2 but the Lord will not answer you in that day.ö
- 1 But the people refused to listen to the voice of Samuel; they said,
- 2 õNo! but we are determined to have a king over us, so that we also may be like other nations, and that our king may govern us and go out before us and fight our battles.ö
- 1 Samuel said to the people,
- 2 õCome, let us go to Gilgal and there renew the kingship.ö
- 1 So all the people went to Gilgal, and there they made Saul king before the Lord in Gilgal.
- 2 There they sacrificed offerings of well-being before the Lord,
- 1 and there Saul and all the Israelites rejoiced greatly.

be not tempted to stay in the safety of known places. Move from where you are to where God points. Hasten from here toward a God who beckons.

Go **<u>now</u>** with God;

be not tempted to go only in your time, when it suits, when it is sure.Bestir yourself now, for now is God's time.
