Revelation 7:9-17

The words we just read in our Call to Worship were drawn from the seventh chapter of the book of Revelation, what one commentator calls, "The last word on evil." When the multitude of God's people from every time and every place in the end face into evil (these chapters reveal), they respond by **singing**. In the end, evil is not explained, **it is surrounded**. "*Greater is he that is in you than he who is in the world*" (1 John 4:4). Endure, this scripture proclaims, for you are already triumphant over it. Songs of faith encircle evil and put it in its place. "Any evil, no matter how fearsome, is exposed as weak and pedantic before such songs."* … Let's listen to a portion of those two chapters in the last book of the Bible.

⁹ After this I (John) looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰ They cried out in a loud voice, saying,

"Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!"

¹¹ And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹² singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

¹³ Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" ¹⁴ I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

¹⁵ For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.

¹⁶ They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat;

¹⁷ for the Lamb at the center of the throne

will be their shepherd,

and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

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John 10:22-30

In this Easter season, the fourth Sunday is often referred to as "*Good Shepherd Sunday*." Before we prayed just now, we sang the twenty third psalm, which lifts up the image of God as our Shepherd. This Good Shepherd leads us through difficult times, and provides for our needs. This Good Shepherd brings us to green pastures and still waters, where a feast awaits and wounds are tended, even as predators watch. They are unable to devour us in the presence of this Good Shepherd. Here we will dwell.

In our gospel lesson for this day, Jesus takes up the Shepherd staff. Listen.

²² At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, ²³ and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. ²⁴ So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." ²⁵ Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; ²⁶ but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. ²⁷ My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹ What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. ³⁰ The Father and I are one."
