That's the situation to which the prophet Isaiah speaks... *(begin video)* ...Using this footage filmed recently of what remains of the city of Aleppo, caught in the middle of the Syrian civil war, try to listen to Isaiah's words of hope from God from the position of someone who has lost everything. You live on the edge, unsure of what tomorrow may bring, if there is a tomorrow. Instead of simply appropriating God's promises to fit our needs, let's allow scripture to speak as it was truly intended. What hope do you hear? ...

The Word of God:

(read intentionally, pausing between lines)

- 1 I am creating new heavens and a new earth; everything of the past will be forgotten...
- 2 Celebrate and be glad forever! I am creating a Jerusalem, full of happy people.
- 1 I will celebrate with Jerusalem and all of its people; there will be no more crying or sorrow in that city.
- 2 No child will die in infancy; everyone will live to a ripe old age.
- 1 Anyone a hundred years old will be considered young, and to die younger than that will be considered a curse.

- 2 My people will live in the houses they build; they will enjoy grapes from their own vineyards.
- 1 No one will take away their homes or vineyards.
- 2 My chosen people will live to be as old as trees, and they will enjoy what they have earned.
- 1 Their work won't be wasted, and their children won't die of dreadful diseases.
- 2 I will bless their children and their grandchildren.
- 1 I will answer their prayers before they finish praying.
- 2 Wolves and lambs will graze together; lions and oxen will feed on straw.
- 1 Snakes will eat only dirt! They won't bite or harm anyone on my holy mountain.
- 2 I, the Lord, have spoken!

Gospel Dramatized Luke 21:5-19

1. Who do you depend upon?

- 1 Some people around Jesus were remarking about how the temple was adorned with beautiful stones and with gifts dedicated to God.
- 2 *(looking around)* Isn't this just the most beautiful church, you've ever seen?
- 3 Yes, we definitely have the nicest one in the area.
- 1 We dedicated it to God, and he certainly has blessed us!
- 2 I'm sure other folks in this valley would love to have what we've got.
- 1 "But Jesus said: "As for what you see here, the time will come when not one stone will be left on another; every one of them will be thrown down."

2. To whom do you listen?

- 1 They asked Jesus:
- 2 Teacher, when will these things happen?
- 3 And what will be the sign that they are about to take place?
- 1 He replied: "Watch out that you are not deceived. For many will come in my name, claiming,
- 2 I am the One!
- 3 The time is near!"

- 2 Follow <u>me</u>!

- 1 Jesus said: "When you hear of wars and revolutions.....

- 1 Do not be frightened. These things must happen first, but the end will not come right away. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom."
- 2 Military exercises continued today in foreign waters. Response was swift with
- 3 Planes carried out a bombing attack before daybreak today.....
- 1 Jesus said: "There will be great earthquakes
- 2 More than one hundred thousand people lost their lives in a devastating earthquake. Authorities say the quake measured 8.1 on the Richter scale
- 1 *sickness*.....
- 3 The virus continues to spread through our community. Health authorities claim they are in epidemic proportions and show no signs of letting up
- 1 famines in various places..."

- 2 Two more shipments of food reached port but never made it to the starving masses. Warlords continue to control....
- 1 Jesus continued: "Fearful events and great signs will come from heaven."
- 2 Scientists claim two asteroids are on a collision course...
- 3 How much science fiction can become actual reality?

4. Where do your loyalties lie?

- 1 Jesus said: "But before all this, they will lay hands on you and persecute you."
- 2 You're under arrest!
- 3 Take that!
- 2 No one with a cell phone camera around. Knock a little sense into him!
- 3 Teach him a lesson!
- 1 Jesus said: "They will deliver you to synagogues ...
- 2 Don't you know the stories about Jesus aren't really true?
- 3 If your Christianity really worked, you wouldn't be suffering like this.....
- 1 and put you in jail....
- 2 We'll put you away for good!
- 1 and you will be brought before kings and governors, and all on account of my name."
- 3 Why do you believe when it is against the law?

2 - You are going against the very things our country stands for. You traitor!

5. Where do you get your words?

- 1 "However, this will result in your being witnesses to them. But make up your mind not to worry beforehand how you will defend yourselves. For I will give you words and wisdom that none of your adversaries will be able to resist or contradict."
- 2 Well, actually, you make a lot of sense.
- 3 I think I'll have to think about this you have a point.
- 1 "You will be betrayed even by parents, brothers, relatives and friends....
- 3 Come on, I'm your mother. After all I've done for you, how can you waste your life following Jesus.
- 2 I've been your best friend since kindergarten. You're too smart for all this. You've been brainwashed.
- 1 and they will put some of you to death. All people will hate you because of me."
- 2 & 3 Kill them! Kill them! Kill them!
- 1 Jesus said: "But not a hair of your head will perish. By standing firm you will gain life."
