A Poem of Integrity

Psalm 112

- P There are many types of Psalms in the book of that name in the Bible. Some psalms are obviously prayers, directed toward God.
- M Some of these are filled with joy and thanksgiving. Others lament bad situations and ask God for help.
- P Some psalms are meant to be sung. The 111th Psalm is a hymn which sings out the goodness of the Lord, giving heartfelt praise for all that God has done. It ends with this verse,
- M "Fear of the Lord is where wisdom begins; sure knowledge is for all who keep God's laws. God's praise lasts forever!"
- P The very next Psalm, #112, explores that verse. It is a poem that speaks about **integrity**. Of interest is that, if we were to read it in Hebrew, the alphabet would be obvious to us. Each line begins with the next letter of the alphabet, from A to Z or, in Hebrew, from Aleph to Tav.
- M You will help read this poem of integrity. Each slide on the screen will have a line from this poem. To the left will be the letter in Hebrew. After the name of that letter is spoken, everyone will speak the line. The first line is not part of the acrostic. Let's speak it together:

(M-guides the "All" P-reads the letters)

The prophet speaks of the absence of Integrity Isaiah 58:1-12

(Pete)

We turn now to the prophet Isaiah, and what he has to say about real **integrity** – what it looks like, as well as what it doesn't look like. Being a "religious" person or, since that word is not in vogue right now, being a "spiritual" person is more than just show. It involves doing what's right. God sent Isaiah to speak to his generation about this. Let's listen, using that Australian paraphrase we've found helpful: the *Laughing Bird* version... Here is Isaiah.

(pause)

1 - God has told me to shout until you people hear; to hammer home the message until it gets through. You are God's people, but God feels betrayed by you. Listen to what God has to say about your sins:

2 - "Day after day, you look good: you turn up to worship and pay attention to my teachings.
You act like a people who want to do what is right; like a people who want to obey to the letter.
You ask me for directions before you do anything, and you seem enthusiastic about getting closer to me.

1 - "Do you want to know why your religious behavior turns me off? Do you want to know why I ignore your fasting and bowing?

I'll tell you why. You put on a great performance of it all,

but then you go straight back to feathering your own nest and ripping off your workers in the process.

- 2 "When you fast, it just makes you irritable and violent; and when you behave like that, I'll just hang up on you.
- 1 "Do you really think this is what I like to see: a day of pious misery? black clothes, long faces and crocodile tears? giving up chocolate and ice-cream? Do you think that's worship? Do you think that pleases me? Give me a break!
- 2 "Do you want to know what I'd really like to see? Dismantle the structures of injustice; take your feet off the throats of the poor; stop jailing the victims of unfair laws; and quit plundering nature's resources.
- 1 "Do you want to know what else I'd like to see? Open your tables to the hungry; open your hearts and your homes to the refugees; open your wardrobes to those without clothes; and don't go hiding every time you see someone in need.
- 2 "Do that, and I'll put your name up in lights! Do that and our relationship will be healed in an instant!

- I'll put you under my personal protection; anyone who attacks you will have to deal with me, the LORD!
- I'll be on hand to respond whenever you need me; just say the word, and I'll be there for you.

1 - "If you abandon all forms of exploitation, and avoid bad-mouthing others to gain an edge; if you share what you have with those in need, and respond to the real needs of suffering communities; then you'll find that the world will light up for you and life will be one beautiful day after another.

2 - "I, the LORD, will always be there to guide you; even in the grip of drought, I'll keep you healthy and well fed. You'll be like an irrigated vineyard with its own deep bore, green and lush and full of life!

1 - "Your ruined houses will be renovated and new; you'll be able to restore the homes that have been in your families for generations. You'll get a reputation for making dreams possible, for enabling everyone to find a good place to live."

Good News

Matthew 5:14-20

Continuing the Good News of Jesus from Matthew 5:13-14... Listen.

"You're here to be light, bringing out the Godcolors in the world. God is not a secret to be kept. We're going public with this, as public as a city on a hill. If I make you light-bearers, you don't think I'm going to hide you under a bucket, do you? I'm putting you on a light stand. Now that I've put you there on a hilltop, on a light stand—shine! Keep open house; be generous with your lives. By opening up to others, you'll prompt people to open up with God, this generous Father in heaven.

"Don't suppose for a minute that I have come to demolish the Scriptures—either God's Law or the Prophets. I'm not here to demolish but to complete. I am going to put it all together, pull it all together in a vast panorama. God's Law is more real and lasting than the stars in the sky and the ground at your feet. Long after stars burn out and earth wears out, God's Law will be alive and working.

"Trivialize even the smallest item in God's Law and you will only have trivialized yourself. But take it seriously, show the way for others, and you will find honor in the kingdom. Unless you do far better than the Pharisees in the matters of right living, you won't know the first thing about entering the kingdom."

Responsive Sending

To bring this worship to an end, we will first speak, and then sing, our words of sending one another out into God's world as salty Jesus people and light bearers. We will use #762 in your hymnal, also projected on the screen. Some lines will be spoken by those on the "left" (that's your left, not mine). - Left: Come as Holy Power and overcome our weakness.
- **Right: Come as Holy Life and dwell in us.**
