## Confession and Assurance

It is not easy following Jesus. To "believe" is to trust in the Lord as completely as possible, and live out your faith, not just speak it. - One: Regretfully, loving God, we confess that we have looked for you in remarkable people and spectacular events;
- All: Yet we have ignored you in the ordinary circumstances, in ordinary friends and neighbours, and in ordinary church members.

- One: Regretfully, loving God, we confess that we have not been very fair to ourselves;
- All: We have hidden our gifts behind false modesty, withheld strengths lest others expect a lot from us, and been too afraid that our faith may be mocked if expressed openly.
- One: Regretfully, loving God, we unfold our lives before you.
- All: Please forgive and expunge the things that are sloppy, unloving or rotten. Please mend the things that are torn or distorted or fractured. Please rehabilitate that soul-image of yourself that exists in each of us, and give us the desire and the will and the strength to make a good fist of living by faith in this new week.
- One: In the name of Christ Jesus our Savior, we pray. Amen!

#### Forgiveness

One: In the name of Jesus of Nazareth, I ask you to accept God's saving love, putting your sins and mistakes behind you, and letting go of regrets and fears. Now face the future with the measured optimism of those who know they are destined to ultimate victory. By saving love you are released; you are at liberty! *All: Thanks be to God!*

# Returning our Tithes and Offerings

It's a hot summer day and you step into a convenience store to grab something to quench your thirst. Arrayed before you are several glass doors, behind which are refrigerated bottles or cans of this soda or that tea, sometimes numbering over a hundred choices. And that is but the beginning of the cold beverage options available.

How, then, are we to hear this scripture about a simple cup of water? It's not Coke or Pepsi or Mountain Dew. It's not Snapple or Sobe or Nestea. It's just water, and not some fancy bottled brand imported from a clear mountain stream in Switzerland. It's simply a cup of water, drawn by hand from a well and thus colder than the above-ground temperature in a hot, dry land.

*"Whoever welcomes you welcomes me,"* Jesus said, and the giving or receiving of a simple cup of water takes on a different meaning as we consider that Jesus is in the middle of it all... As you return your offering, think about the simple act of drawing water from a well and freely sharing it with a stranger who then becomes a friend. Welcome Jesus with your gift.
