
Refrain: Great is the Lord, he is holy and just, by his power we trust in his love. Great is the Lord, he is faithful and true, by his mercy he proves he is love.














'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, and grace my fears relieved. How precious did that grace appear the hour I first believed.


