a few words on the Word

It is said that in the darkness of a mother womb, a child-to-be can hear. Powerful is the voice of the one who bears us and brings us to birth. That voice and, after we come into the world as flesh and blood, the face of a mother of these (her words and her face) create a mighty bond which lasts a lifetime.

Imagine the first moments of the life of Jesus. Is it any wonder that Mary figures so prominently in the story as we have received it? Later on in Johnøs gospel, this motherøs words are enough to get her grown son to step forth into his first recorded miracle, the changing of water into wine at a wedding in Cana of Galilee. Such words are, indeed, powerful, whether spoken by a mother, or by the One who gave birth to all things in the beginning. õ*Let there be light*,ö God said in creating the earth, and this word made it so. õ*And behold, it was very good*.ö

On this night of nights, we remember when Word became flesh and dwelt among us. We celebrate the birth of the One we call õMessiahö or õChrist,ö who entered this world as all children do. The circumstances were not ideal, but when are they ever? Yes, he grew up, as little ones do, but the point is ó he was as all children are.

And yet, this child was also God in human form. This is one of the great paradoxes of our Christian faith. Please hear the õdoxaö in the word, õparadox,ö for from it we derive the word õdoxology.ö We stand before a mystery which brings forth from us silence and awe. Theologians long ago struggled to explain the incarnation, their words ultimately falling short. Even today, we are little more than shepherds who hear angels sing in the night and dumbfoundedly wander in the direction of the light.

This light shines in our darkness. Like children in our mother womb, we are preparing for birth. And when the day dawns, there will be the voice and the face our Creatorí This Word made flesh who came to dwell among us long ago in human form, and who comes to us now as heaven breath of the Holy Spirit, this Word provides for us light and life, and leads us toward a new beginning in the light of the Kingdom. No darkness can extinguish this Lightí

In a few moments, we will symbolically pass the light of Christ from one person to the next. Practically speaking, do be careful with these candles. Parents, please watch over your children. This is, after all, a flame, and fire can burn. Remember, this light shines within each one of us, and will continue to do so long after we blow out our candlesí Before we sing õSilent Nightö and pass along the light, would you lift up your voices with mine and join in a unison prayer?

Unison Prayer

God of grace and truth, in Jesus Christ you came among us as light shining in darkness. We confess that we have not welcomed the light, or trusted good news to be good. We have closed our eyes to glory in our midst, expecting little, and hoping for less. Forgive our doubt, and renew our hope, so that we may receive the fullness of your grace, and live in the truth of Christ the Lord.
