A verse to guide

Matthew 5:48

in various translations & paraphrases

- 1 - In his Sermon on the Mount, *(click)*
- 2 - his Sermon on the Mount ain, Jesus said: *(click)*
- 1 - “Be perfect, therefore,
as your heavenly Father is perfect.” *(NRSV & NIV)*
- 2 - The word “perfect” *(click)* can catch us up, for we are all far from perfect.
- 1 - Perfection can seem as far away from us as the peak of Mount Kenya is in this picture.
- 2 - It’s impossible. Only the sturdiest of climbers can “be perfect” as “God most high.”
- 1 - With a telescope, however, *(click)* we can see the mountaintop.
- 2 - In Greek, the word, “perfect,” *(click)* shares the same root as the word, “telescope.”
- 1 - It means, “Distant,” *(click)*
- 2 - or “far away.”
- 1 - “Something distant from us is brought closer.”
- 2 - Or “we are brought nearer to something far away.”
- 1 - Keep this in mind as you listen to some other translations or paraphrases of this verse. *(click)*
- 2 - “Keep aiming to do better. Model yourselves on the perfect love of your Father in heaven and settle for nothing less.” *(click)* *(Laughing Bird)*

- 1 - *But you are called to something higher:* “Be perfect, as your Father in heaven is perfect.” *(click)* *(The Voice)*
- 2 - But you must always act like your Father in heaven. *(click)* *(CEV)*
- 1 - Now you, you all must be mature, as your spiritual Father is mature. *(click)* *(Cotton Patch)*
- 2 - Therefore, just as your heavenly Father is complete in showing love to everyone, so also you must be complete. *(click)* *(CEB)*
- 1 - “In a word, what I’m saying is, *Grow up*. You’re kingdom subjects. Now live like it. Live out your God-created identity. Live generously and graciously toward others, the way God lives toward you.” *(The Message)*

Torah Reading

Leviticus 19:1-2, 9-18

Meghan:

We will read from the Torah, God's Law for the children of Israel. You have a part in this, a phrase that repeated in the scripture. Whenever we point to you, please read:

All:

I am the Lord your God.

Let's practice *(do so)* ... Now listen to God's Law.

Pete:

The Lord told Moses to say to the community of Israel, Be holy, because I, the Lord your God, am holy.

When you harvest your fields,

do not cut the corn at the edges of the fields,
and do not go back to cut the ears of corn
that were left.

Do not go back through your vineyard

to gather the grapes that were missed
or to pick up the grapes that have fallen;
leave them for poor people and foreigners.

All:

I am the Lord your God.

Meghan:

Do not steal or cheat or lie.

Do not make a promise in my name if you do not
intend to keep it;

that brings disgrace on my name.

All:

I am the Lord your God.

Pete:

Do not take advantage of anyone or rob him.

Do not hold back the wages of someone you have
hired, not even for one night.

Do not curse a deaf man or

put something in front of a blind man so as
to make him stumble over it.

Obey me;

All:

I am the Lord your God.

Meghan:

Be honest and just when you make decisions
in legal cases;

do not show favoritism to the poor
or fear the rich.

Do not spread lies about anyone, and
when someone is on trial for his life,
speak out if your testimony can help him.

All:

I am the Lord your God.

Pete:

Do not bear a grudge against anyone,

but settle your differences with him,
so that you will not commit a sin because of him.

Do not take revenge on anyone or continue
to hate him,

but love your neighbor as you love yourself.

All:

I am the Lord your God.
