- B We began worship with a reading from the prophet Isaiah, which invited us to

- B Now we turn to another scripture from the Hebrew portion of the Bible,
- S which shifts our focus to another important woman in the Bible.
- B A book is named after her.
- S Listen to how her story begins. (pause)
- B In the days when the judges ruled, there was a famine in the land.
- S So a man from Bethlehem in Judah,
- B together with his wife and two sons,
- S went to live for a while in the country of Moab.
- B The man's name was Elimelek.
- S his wife's name was Naomi,
- B and the names of his two sons were Mahlon and Kilion.
- S They were Ephrathites from Bethlehem, Judah.
- B And they went to Moab and lived there.

- S Now Elimelek, Naomi's husband, died, and she was left with her two sons.
- B They married Moabite women,
- S one named Orpah and the other **Ruth**.
- B After they had lived there about ten years,
- S both Mahlon and Kilion also died,
- B and Naomi was left without her two sons
- S and her husband.

- S It's quite an adventure, but it begins with a lament.
- B Naomi and her daughter-in-law, Ruth, face bitter circumstances.
- S But that's not the end of the story.
- B Perhaps we will hear more later on.
- S Yes, I think we will!
